## The Collect of the Day 3rd Sunday of Easter

O God, whose blessed Son made himself known to his disciples in the breaking of bread: Open the eyes of our faith, that we may behold him in all his redeeming work; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

## The First Reading I John 1:1-2:2

<sup>1:1</sup> We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life— <sup>2</sup>this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us— <sup>3</sup>we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. <sup>4</sup>We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

<sup>5</sup>This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. <sup>6</sup>If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; <sup>7</sup>but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. <sup>8</sup>If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup>If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. <sup>10</sup>If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

<sup>2:1</sup> My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; <sup>2</sup>and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

## The Gospel Luke 24:36b-48

<sup>36b</sup> Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, ‘Peace be with you.’ <sup>37</sup>They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. <sup>38</sup>He said to them, ‘Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? <sup>39</sup>Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have.’ <sup>40</sup>And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. <sup>41</sup>While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, ‘Have you anything here to eat?’ <sup>42</sup>They gave him a piece of broiled fish, <sup>43</sup>and he took it and ate in their presence.

<sup>44</sup> Then he said to them, ‘These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.’ <sup>45</sup>Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, <sup>46</sup>and he said to them, ‘Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, <sup>47</sup>and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. <sup>48</sup>You are witnesses of these things.

## ABOUT THE ART SHOW

**St Luke’s is so pleased to present *Witness to Faith: The Biblical Prints of Sadao Watanabe***, featuring original works of graphic art by Japan’s foremost Christian artist of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Born in 1913, Watanabe was baptized as a Christian at age 17 and devoted his life to depicting the stories of the Bible in a visual language understandable to the Japanese. He used a traditional technique for dyeing textiles with hand cut stencils from the Okinawa Islands to make prints on paper. When Watanabe died in 1996, he left behind a visual legacy unique in contemporary sacred art that can be found in major museums across the world, including the Vatican Museum and our National Gallery. His chief desire was for his biblical prints to be seen in variety of public places by as broad an audience as possible. Saint Luke’s hopes that *Witness to Faith: The Biblical Art of Sadao Watanabe* will fulfill Watanabe’s wish and bring new insight and delight to our favorite Bible stories.

## OUTREACH: PREGNANCY CENTER & CLINIC

\$2,510

**For more than 30 years the Pregnancy Center and Clinic of the Low Country (PCCLC) has helped women choose life for their babies.** PCCLC provides prenatal care to uninsured women residing in Beaufort and Jasper counties. In 2020, 617 girls and women were assisted through 4,343 contacts, appointments, pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, prenatal vitamins, laboratory tests, baby items, classes, Bible study and support groups. With your support PCCLC will purchase several new laptops, and printer/scanner for our 2 clinics. These purchases will eliminate the nurse, interpreter and volunteer having to share a computer when checking in clients, scheduling appointments, retrieving lab results or documenting visit notes. Our clients have benefitted greatly, especially during this past year, with our ability to connect electronically and the purchase of additional equipment will further improve our ability to be more responsive to our moms and babies.
