There are 8 of us going: Robyn Zimmerman, Amber Bagnulo, Celia Carroll, Katie Reese, Jack McNulty, Meredith Kronz, Bill Phillips, and Kathie Phillips. Please lift us up in prayer from now until we return. We are praying that you will respond to God's call to help us as we gather items for the children at Jericho Villas. We bringing gently used clothing, (new underwear), socks, shoes (also gently used). The 42 children are so appreciative of the new (to them) items. The children also, love games, legos and football (our soccer). We also would appreciate cash to pay the extra luggage fees for the luggage we bring (\$30 times 10 suitcases) and to fill in the gaps of the things that the children greatly need. We also need 6 more suitcases....we have 4. These suitcases will not returned. Donations may be brought to the Ministry Center and checks should be made out to St. Luke's, with Honduras Missions on the memo. St. Luke's has been supporting Jericho Ministries for over 20 years. We have seen the ministry grow from a small shop and work shop to a home for children who have been abused in so many ways, to 2 schools, a ministry to the "dump" in Tegucigalpa, a workshop to teach the women from the streets (let the reader understand), and a shop to sell the goods that the women make and so very much more. Thank for your love and generosity and may God richly bless you as you have blessed these children.

          5. Two questions

### II. Body

- A. No one can say "Jesus is Lord" without the Holy Spirit (ICor 12:3b)
  1. I have asked people ...
  2. if He is your Savior
  3. if He is your Lord
  4. the Holy Spirit moves in our hearts and lives
  5. He will use you
  6. representing His life and light
- B. The gifts (ICor 12:4-6)
  1. believers in Jesus, then ...
  2. and yet ... different
- C. Thirdly, in order to do so, we must empty ourselves (Phil 2:5f)

2On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. 2Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. 3When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, ‘They have no wine.’ 4And Jesus said to her, ‘Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.’ 5His mother said to the servants, ‘Do whatever he tells you.’ 6Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. 7Jesus said to them, ‘Fill the jars with water.’ And they filled them up to the brim. 8He said to them, ‘Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.’ So they took it. 9When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom 10and said to him, ‘Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk.
