A little more than 25 years ago, Memory Matters started here at St. Luke's to provide respite for caregivers whose loved ones were living with Alzheimer's or other forms of dementia. Due to the gracious staff, volunteers and donors, Memory Matters has expanded over the years to providing day programs for those living with early to moderate Alzheimer's and dementia. We offer counseling and support groups for family members. In addition, we provide community education about brain health and how we can all have a better brain through exercise, eating along the Mediterranean diet, socializing, lifelong learning, and restfulness. Part of having a healthy brain is knowing how your memory is functioning. That's why Memory Matters gives free Memory Screens to anyone. As most non-profit organizations, Memory Matters relies heavily on volunteers. Our volunteers work in different capacities to include, in programming to assist our Program Specialists lead different activities with our participants. If a volunteer doesn't want to work directly with the participants, we also need men and women to work in our kitchen by dishing out lunch and serving it to the participants. Staff also need assistance answering phones and completing clerical tasks. Finally, we are always looking for volunteers for our fundraising events. An example is during our upcoming 5K/10K by manning information and food tables for the runners and walkers. Without volunteers, Memory Matters would cease to exist. Their time is precious, and we recognize that and only want volunteers to provide us with as little or as much time they feel comfortable with.
